

INFORMATION ON PERSONAL DATA PROCESSING

1. The Controller of your personal data is Polish Development Fund S.A. based in Warsaw at ul. Krucza 50, 00-025 Warsaw, hereinafter referred to as the "Controller".
2. In matters concerning the processing of your personal data and your rights related thereto, you may contact the Controller by e-mail at iod@pfr.pl or in writing at the Controller's registered office address indicated in paragraph 1 above.
3. Your personal data will be processed for:
 - (a) registration and participation in the informational webinar "How to become a Pioneer?" - on the basis of Article 6(1)(a) of the RODO, i.e. on the basis of the consent given by completing and submitting the registration form for the information webinar "How to become a Pioneer";
 - b) handling complaint requests and conducting business communications - on the basis of Article 6(1)(f) RODO, i.e. on the basis of the Controller's legitimate interest;
 - c) sending marketing information regarding the Controller's offer. The offer is sent only if you have given your consent. Consent is given by checking the appropriate checkbox.
4. Your personal data will be processed until the legal basis for their processing expires. Personal data related to the sending of marketing information concerning the Controller's offer will be processed until you withdraw your consent.
5. Recipients of your personal data may be entities performing tasks on behalf of the Controller, with whom the Controller has entered into appropriate agreements.
6. Your personal data will not be transferred to recipients located in countries outside the European Economic Area.
7. You have the following rights: a) to access your personal data, b) to request to correct your personal data, c) to request to delete your personal data d) to request restriction of processing your personal data, e) to object to the processing of your data. To the extent that your personal data is processed on the basis of consent, you may withdraw it at any time, however, without affecting the legality of the processing carried out before its withdrawal.
8. You have the right to lodge a complaint to the supervisory authority, i.e. the President of the Personal Data Protection Office.
9. Provision of personal data is voluntary, however it is necessary for the process of registration and participation in conferences, training courses, as well as for handling claims and efficient business communication.
10. Your personal data will not be processed in an automated manner (including profiling).
